- (ii) Items designed and intended to be filled at the point of sale and "disposable" items sold, filled or designed and intended to be filled at the point of sale shall be considered to be packaging provided they fulfil a packaging function.

<sup>&</sup>quot;Following a request by certain acceding States for consultation on the proposal to revise Directive 94/62/EC, in accordance with the interim arrangements for the period preceding accession, the Commission concluded that the requests by the acceding countries for transitional periods with respect to the targets of Article 1(2) were justified.

In line with this conclusion, the Commission will put forward a proposal with a view to putting in place the necessary provisions before the deadline for transposition of the current revision directive expires".

**Nota Bene**: In order to reach an overall agreement on this dossier, it will be essential to solve the questions posed by the European Court of Justice in the recent judgements in cases C-458/00, C-228/00 and C-116/01. In fact, the Common Position was agreed under the assumption that recovery includes incineration at waste incineration plants with energy recovery. Although this question was not addressed by the common position and has not been the subject of an amendment by the European Parliament in second reading, it is crucial that an appropriate common solution be established in the context of the conciliation procedure. The proposed text clarifies that this type of incineration should be counted for the targets of subparagraphs (a) and (b).

In fact, the Common Position was agreed under the assumption that recovery includes incineration at waste incineration plants with energy recovery. Although this question was not addressed by the common position and has not been the subject of an amendment by the European Parliament in second reading, it is crucial that an appropriate common solution be established in the context of the conciliation procedure. The proposed text clarifies that this type of incineration should be counted for the target of subparagraph (a).
